# 10 LOWER MERION Ardmore Track Squad Scores 35½ Points to Win District No. 1 Honors

Bethlehem, Pa., May 16.—After a close battle with Haverford, Ambler and Bethlehem High, Lower Merion captured its sixth straight triumph in the P. I. A. A. District No. 1 track and field championship on Liberty High Field this afternoon with a total of 35½ points.

The other contenders finished as follows: Ambler, 29; Haverford, 28; Bethlehem, 25½; Upper Darby, 18; Lower Merion was awarded the Mitchell and Ness Trophy.

Irwin Brown, dusky Norristown athlete, won high individual honors with a total of 10½ points when he won the quarter, tied for first in the pole vault at a record-breaking height and was fifth in the broad jump. One new record was established in the pole vault when Brown and George Muller, of Haverford, leaped to a height of 11 feet 5¼ inches, the former district record being 11 feet 1 inch and the State record 11 feet 3¼ inches.

# Lower Merion Wins District One, P. I. A. A. Title For Sixth Time

## Suburban Team Tops Fine Field at Bethlehem—Ath- lete of Norristown Takes Individual Honors

Although given a close fight for honors by three other contenders, the Lower Merion High track and field athletes emerged triumphant for their sixth straight win in the District One championship of the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association yesterday afternoon on the Bethlehem High field with a total score of 35½. Ambler was second with 29 points; Haverford, third with 28 points, Bethlehem fourth with 25½ and Upper Darby fifth with 18.

It was Lower Merion's ability to score heavily in the field events that kept the title with that school and brought the Mitchell and Ness trophy back to their school again.

The trophy for individual high score went to Irwin Brown, dusky athlete of Norristown, who scored a total of 10½ points consisting of first place in the 440-yard dash, tie for first with a record breaking leap in the pole vault and fifth in the broad jump. MacIntyre of Ambler, who finished a close second, scoring ten points by taking first place in both dash events, competed for the first time in two weeks for his school as he had been on the sick list with an infected tooth.

The one record broken Saturday afternoon was by a very decisive margin when Brown of Norristown and George Miller of Haverford cleared the pole vault bar at 11 feet, 5¼ inches to surpass the former district mark of 11 feet 1 inch held jointly by Akine and Christman of Norristown and Iredal of Ridley Park made in 1927 and 1928. This is also a new state mark, the former height being 11 feet and 3¾ inches, also made by Akine and Christman of Norristown.

The Pierce School trophy for the winning team in the mile relay event went to Lansdale. Lower Merion was denied three points in this race when the team which finished third was found to include two men who had not been duly entered in this meet.

To Bethlehem goes the honor of placing men in the greatest number of events. Red and Blue had athletes scoring in ten of the thirteen events, although this list did not include first places. Lower Merion scored in eight events including eight points in the discus five of which were made by Siegel. Other first places for the district champions were won by Buck in the half mile and Johnson in the broad jump.

**BETHLEHEM, Pa., May 16.**—Sturdy young athletes from Lower Merion High School today captured the sixth annual P. I. A. A. District No. 1 track and field meet held in the athletic field at Bethlehem High. It was the fifth time that the silver trophy has been presented in succession to the Lower Merion lads, the very first meet in 1925 having been won by Norristown. The Lower Merion boys today had no run-away of the meet, although the school made 35½ points. Ambler pushed the winner hard and came through for second place with 29 points. This is just one point more than was scored by Haverford with 28. Norristown, however, had the honor of having on her team the lad who scored the highest total of points individually, and to Irwin Brown went the silver trophy indicating this honor. He scored 10½ points. Bethlehem High came in fourth and Upper Darby fifth.
