

UPIDAH ATHLETES COP TRACK TITLE IN DISTRICT ONE

Knock Out Norristown, the 1934 Champions, in Annual Meet at Wayne Field. Prospect Park Is Victor in Class B

COUNTY BOYS OUTCLASSED; FIVE DISTRICT RECORDS ARE SMASHED

Chester county schools failed to put any group in the annual P. I. A. A. District 1 track and field meet held at Wayne Field, here, Saturday, and won by Upper Darby High.

The Upidah boys defeated Norristown High as Class A champions of the event by pulling up a total of 45 5-6 points. Norristown, however, made a gallant attempt to ward off the challenge and was leading until the final two events. Its total points for the meet were 25.

Lower Merion took third place in Class A with 27 1/2 points. The other teams finished in the following order: Ambler, 21 1/4; Lansdowne, 20; Haverford, 14 1/2; Ridley Park, 9; Media, 8; Abington, 3; Lansdale, 3; Haverford, 2; West Chester, 2; Chester, 1; Kennett Square, 1; Downingtown, 1; and Glen Nor, 1.

Prospect Park and Swarthmore fought it out for top honors in Class B and the Prospect Park boys ultimately carried off the crown with a total of 59 1/2 points. Swarthmore totaled 48 1/2 points.

The remaining teams of Class B were completely outclassed by the two leaders. Upper Moreland, which finished third, boasting but 14 points. The other scores were: Avon Grove, 13; Sharon Hill, 8; Yeaddon, 6; Oxford, 6; Jenkintown, 4; Hatboro, 1.

FIVE MARKS FALL

Five records were broken during the course of the meet, four in Class A and one in Class B.

New meet standards were set in the 220-yard dash, the mile relay, the shot put and the javelin throw in Class A, while the only record-breaking performance of Class B was in the high jump.

The new mile relay mark was set by the fast-stepping Lansdowne High quartet. Given tough opposition by Norristown, Upper Darby and West Chester, the Lansdowne combination of Jack Ricksecker, Don Parsons, Fred Wetzel and Ray Wilbur, stepped the mile in 3 minutes, 31.9 seconds. This lowered a mark of 3 minutes, 32.1 seconds set by West Chester High's 1932 (Cesana, Porter, Rustin, Walter, quartet).

LOCALS FOURTH

NEW JUMP RECORD

In Class B, Jack Taylor, Swarthmore's great star, who was high scorer for the day with 14 points, set a new record in the high jump with a leap of 5 feet, 11 5/8 inches. This bettered his own record of 1923, which was 5 feet, 7 1/2 inches and came within one-eighth of an inch of equaling the Class A record. It was a better jump than the one which won this event in Class A Saturday.

Downingtown's highly-touted Ronald "Streaky" Collins, dash ace par excellence, failed to distinguish himself in Saturday's meet. In the 100, which he won at 10 seconds flat, at the county meet one week previous, Collins failed to reach the finals. The county meet was the final. He also failed to reach the finals of the 220.

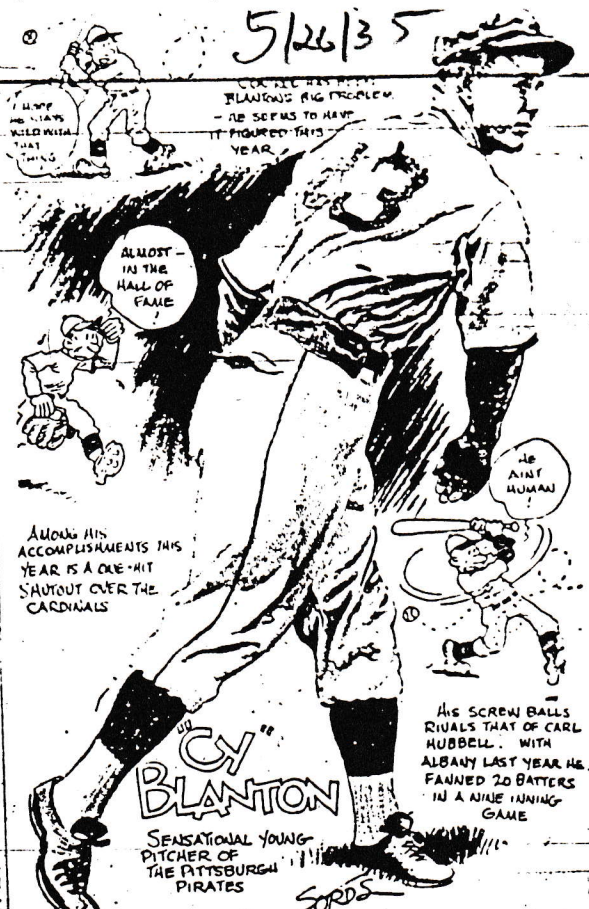

SWARTHMORE IN TRACK VICTORY

High School Tops Ridley Park as Jack Taylor Shines

Swarthmore High School defeated the Ridley Park High School trackers yesterday afternoon on the losers field by the score of 65½ to 42½.

The Garnet and Gray made a clean sweep in mile run and came near enough in several other events to take the decision. Griffin won the mile from two of his team mates in the easy time of five minutes and 12 seconds. He also placed third in the 440-yard dash, won by Mitchell, of Ridley Park, in the fast time of 54.5 seconds.

Jack Taylor, the Swarthmore speedster, captured the high scoring honors with 19 points. John Smith, Ridley Park's husky weightman and all around athlete, pressed him close and ran second with 17 markers.

Smith won the shot with a fine toss of 49 feet 9½ inches to win easily. John also took the discus with a heave of 118 feet four inches to win with feet to spare. He also placed second in the javelin, won by Richards, of Swarthmore, with a fine throw of 158 feet four inches.

Delaware county athletes turned a sizzling performances Saturday afternoon at West Chester, where they captured 17 of the 23 championships in the P. I. A. A. District 1, track meet. Five districts records were shattered as Upper Darby nosed out Norristown for the Class A championship and Prospect Park annexed the title in Class B.

Roy Wolfgangs Royals who have been undefeated in major meets this season scored only one win all afternoon, as Frazier beat out the stumbling Chamberlin in the low hurdles, but the champions placed heavily in every event to outscore Pete Lewis' Norristown Eagles who were blanked in the final events, the board jump and the pole vault.

Final results in the Class A competition were as follows: Upper Darby, 42 5-6; Norristown, 38; Lower Merion, 27 1-3; Lansdowne, 23; Ambler, 21 5-6; Haverford, 14 1-3; Ridley Park, 9; West Chester, 2; Abington, 3; Ridley Township, 2 1-3; Chester, 1; Downingtown, 1; Kennett Square, 1; and Glen-Nor, 1-3.

Swarthmore and Prospect, Park dominated every event in the Class B division and despite the fact that the Parkers came through in only the half-mile relay and the furlong sprint, both of which were easy wins for Bill Steele, they outscored their rivals by a wide margin, 60 point to 49.

Lansdowne Wins Relay

In winning the mile relay by more than fifty yards, the quartet of Lansdowne High sprinters, Rickseker, Parsons, Wetzel and Wilbur, who ran in that order, clipped 2 seconds of the former record held by West Chester High, and won in 3 minutes and 31.9 seconds. Each of the runners added a ten-yard lead over a fast Norristown team, until the final lap when Ray Wilbur, sensational half-miler, added 20 yards and breezed in barely under the record.

Johnny Smith, Ridley Park weightman, tossed the shot 50 feet 5½ inches to bat out Don Vogt, of Lower Merion. Both of them bettered the former record of 49 feet 7¼ inches set in 1928 by another burly Ridley Park athlete, John Slezak.

The furlong record set by Graham of Chester High in 1927, was shattered by Lee Ramsdell, of Haverford, who negotiated the 220 yards in 22.2 seconds. Ramsdell, who is the son of Tex Ramsdell, erstwhile Penn cinderman, set this record after Wetzel, of Lansdowne, had beaten him out in the 100-yard event.

Tossing the javelin with a stiff wind to assist him, Mike Santangelo and Mike Carcappa, of Norristown, clipped many feet of the former record of 161 feet and 2½ inches. Santangelo's winning throw was measured at 177 feet and 6 inches.

A determined attack on the pole vault record was credited to Broadbent, Lansdowne's sensational vaulter, who barely nipped the bar at 12 feet after he had won this event at 11 feet and 8 inches, which is 2½ inches off the district mark. He twice cleared the bar at record heights only to hit it with his hands in coming down, and miss a new record.

A little competition might have meant a new record for Frank Maule who finished the mile-run in 4 minutes and 40.5 seconds, one-tenth of a second slower than the State record. Maule and Bob Burnett were the only Media High entries in the meet, and the miler took an early lead in his event, set a dazzling pace, and even then finished with a thirty-yard margin, running away from his nearest rival, Earl Dehner, Chester High

A determined attack on the pole vault record was credited to Broadbent, Lansdowne's sensational vaulter, who barely nipped the bar at 12 feet after he had won this event at 11 feet and 8 inches, which is 2½ inches off the district mark. He twice cleared the bar at record heights only to hit it with his hands in coming down and miss a new record.
 A little competition might have meant a new record for Frank Maule who finished the mile-run in 4 minutes and 40.5 seconds, one-tenth of a second slower than the State record. Maule and Bob Burnett were the only Media High entries in the meet, and the miller took an early lead in his event, set a dazzling pace, and even then finished with a thirty-yard margin, running away from his nearest rival. Earl Dehner, Chester High youngster, tied to keep pace with the flying County Seater, but fell behind on the last lap and finished fifth.

Taylor High Scorer
 Swarthmore's handful of classy performers took half of the first places in Class B, with their great sprinter and jumper, Jack Taylor, garnering 14 points for the meet's best individual performance. Taylor set a new record for the Class B high jump with a leap of 5 feet, 9¼ inches and he won the century dash in 10.1 seconds, which was a better performance than the Class A winner and was only one-tenth behind the district record.

Ernie Polk, also from Swarthmore, was the only other double winner of the meet. He took the low hurdles and managed to beat Taylor in the broad jump.

Prospect Park's consistent point-getters led by Bill Steele, dimmed the Swarthmore luminaries in the matter of team scores, and their relay team of Tinley, Sperling, Rodgers and Steele finished the half-mile relay in 1 minute and 37.5 seconds. This establishes the district record since it is the first year for the event.

Yeadon entered Class B track competition, when Hartshaw won the discus event, throwing against the wind and trimming a galaxy of Swarthmore and Prospect stars. Morrison, of Sharon Hill, also starred with a near record 11-foot performance in the pole vault.
