

# Norristown, Ambler Win In West Chester Track

WEST CHESTER, May 21.—Ambler, a favorite, and Norristown, a dark horse, emerged triumphant in the 12th annual District One P. I. A. A. track and field championships here today as 16 district records were broken.

Supplying its punch in the meet's final two events, Norristown nosed out Lower Merion High by a half point, 46 to 45½, and topped a field of 16 other suburban high schools in the district's Class A division. Upper Darby, Lansdale and Cheltenham finished third, fourth and fifth.

Ambler, victor in the Villanova Interscholastics a week ago, also used the meet's final events to gain its triumph, nosing out a surprisingly strong Radnor team, 41 1-3 to 35, for the Class B honors. Ridley Park and Springfield (Del. Co.), contenders during the early stages, finished third and fourth, ahead of 16 other entries.

## A DAY OF RECORD-BREAKING

Ten Class B marks and six Class A records were shattered and eight marks accepted as P. I. A. A. standards were bettered during the day. Two other records were not allowed because of a breeze that kicked up late in the afternoon.

Most sensational was a 1 minute, 57.1 second half-mile turned in by Dick Belyea, Upper Darby's crack middle distance star.

Pushed by Zerfing, a teammate, for a lap and a half, Belyea came hammering home to eclipse by three-tenths of a second the record he established here last year. Following this performance he anchored the Upper Darby mile relay team to a mile district record, the four turning in a 3-minute, 29.2 second mark. Belyea's 50.3 second quarter in this event was in a large measure responsible for the team triumph.

Four double winners were returned. Dick James, Radnor's Negro sprinter, annexed both Class B 100 and 200-yard dashes, a performance that was repeated by Fred Wetzel, Lansdowne flyer, in Class A. Both of Wetzel's times clipped district records. Bob Beatty, of Ridley Park, who set new records with triumphs in the Class B javelin and discus.

Not only did 10 Class B and six Class A records tumble, but eight marks accepted as State P. I. A. A. times and distances were bettered during the day. #### Dick Belyea Sparkles.

Most sensational of all records broken was a 1 minutes, 57.1 seconds half-mile turned in by Dick Belyea, Upper Darby's crack middle distance star.

Pushed by Zerfing, a teammate, for a lap and a half, Belyea came thundering home to eclipse by .3 of a second the record he established here last year. Following this performance, he anchored a fleet-footed Upper Darby mile relay team to a mile district record, the four turning in a 3 minute, 29.2 seconds mark. Belyea's 50.3 second quarter in this event was in a large measure responsible for the team triumph.

Four double winners were returned during the course of events, in which approximately 500 athletes participated. Dick James, dusky Radnor sprinter, annexed both the Class B century and 220, a performance that was repeated by Fred Wetzel, Lansdowne flyer in Class A. Both of Wetzel's times clipped district records. Bob Beatty, of Ridley Park, also set new records with triumphs in the Class B javelin and discus.

#### Bryant Ace for Ambler.

It was Oliver Bryant, versatile Ambler cinderman, however, who was responsible for the team victory scored by the Class B favorite. While the teams of Belyea, Beatty and Wetzel were running behind, Bryant came through in the clutch

with victories in the 440 and bro jump. His time was 51.4 second for the quarter.

Other record-breakers include Earl Jenkins, of Radno, in the 1 yard Class B low hurdles; John DiCarlo, of Lower Merion, in the 220 Class A dash; Arnold Olse in the Class B mile; Al Johnson of Morrisville, in the Class B 88 Sam Polischuk, of Ridley Park, the Class B shot; A. Berrien, Radnor, in the Class B discus; Wasser, of Norristown, in the Class A pole vault; Morrisville in the Class B mile relay, and Radnor in the half-mile Class B relay.

Wasser's record-breaking pole vault of 12 feet even earned the points that meant the difference between first and second for the Norristown team. With his over the last, he cleared the bar on his final jump as close to 300 spectators cheered.

#### Jackson Takes High Jump.

In the second to last event, the high jump, Willie Jackson, Wasser's teammate, also came through with a first and important score. His height was 6 feet 1 inch, an inch short of another district record.

# NORRISTOWN RETAINS DEFEATS ARDMORE ACES BY ONE-HALF POINT IN CLASS A

Garners Eight Points in Pole Vault, Final Event of Meet At Wayne Field, to Eke Out Triumph. Ambler Sweeps to Victory in Class B Competition. 13 Records Tumble As Schoolboy Athletes Perform Sensationally.

With records falling right and left, athletes of District One in the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association battled tooth and nail for honors in two classes on Wayne Field, at the Teachers College, here, Saturday afternoon.

The contest for championship laurels in Class A continued right up until the final event, when Norristown, defending champion, but a dark horse in Saturday's meet, came from behind to nip Lower Merion by a margin of one-half point. By picking up eight points in the pole vault, Norristown boosted its total to 46 points. Lower Merion completely bereft of points in this event, finished with a total of 45 1/2 points. Upper Darby, which failed to place in either the pole vault or high jump, final events of the meet, took third honors with a total of 37 points.

Ambler High, the favorite in Class B, vindicated that pre-meeting rating by running up 41 1/3 points to garner the title. Radnor High finished in the second spot with 35 points, while Ridley Park, the defending champion, was a decisively defeated third with only 29 1/2 points.

The assault on District records was led by Class B athletes as they shattered a total of eight marks during the afternoon. Class A lads, however, also did their share as they cracked five marks, set one new record in a new event and equalled one existing District standard. All in all, a total of 14 records were established and one was equalled.

In the District One record-breaking orgy, it was recorded that nine State P. I. A. A. records were bettered. New State records, however, may be established only at the State meet, held annually in Harrisburg.

Two additionally records broken during the course of the meet were not allowed because of a stiff wind blowing at the time they were recorded. These records were in the 120-yard low hurdles, of Class B, and the 200-yard low hurdles of Class A.

Wetzel in Limelight. Heading the list of record-smashers was Fred Wetzel, Lansdowne High's classy dash champion. Wetzel won both the century and 220, and in both events was credited

Morton, incidentally also pushed Fred wetzel to his 99 record in the century, finishing just a split second behind the victor.

Phoenixville, the only other county team in Class A, scored only one point. Steve Magyar finishing fifth in the 200-yard low hurdles.

Record Performers Of District Me

FRED WETZEL, LANSDOWNE HIGH—Won the 100-yard dash 9.9 seconds to lower District 1 of 10 seconds set by Gillin, Arlington, in 1926 and equalled by Ham, Chester, in 1927. Also the 220 in 21.4 seconds to set District mark of 22.4 and equalisting State mark.

CHARLES ROBERTSON, LOWER MERION—Negotiated 120-high hurdles in 16 seconds flat set District record for a new event. Won 220-yard low hurdles in 22.7 seconds but record was not allowed because of wind.

DICK BELYEA, UPPER DARBY—Won the 880 in 1 minute, 57.1 seconds, lowering his own District mark of 1:57.4 and bettering own State mark of 1:58.8.

Heading the list of record-smashers was Fred Wetzel, Lansdowne High's classy dash champion. Wetzel won both the century and 220, and in both events was credited with record-breaking performances. In the 100 he broke the ape in 9.9, bettering the 10 seconds flat mark which had stood since away back in 1926. The 220 saw him turn in a 21.4 seconds performance, which not only clipped a full second from the existing District mark, also set in 1926, but equalled the State record.

#### Dick Belyea Gleams.

Outstanding among the sensational victories of the meet was that of Dick Belyea, Upper Darby middle-distance ace, in the 880-yard run. Belyea ran the two laps in 1 minute, 57.1 seconds to lower his own District mark of 1 minute, 57.4 seconds and better his own State mark of 1 minute, 58.8 seconds.

Pushed by Zerfing, a teammate, Belyea led the pack from start to finish and was pulling away with every stride as he breezed across the finish line. Zerfing, in second place, was almost 50 yards behind at the finish.

To top off his performance of the day, Belyea also appeared as anchor man on the Upper Darby mile relay team which set a new record in that event. His 50.3 final lap was an important item in giving Upper Darby its victory and in setting the new record. The Upper Darby team negotiated the mile in 3 minutes, 29.2 seconds, lowering the District mark of 3 minutes, 30.6 seconds, which it established last year.

West Chester High, lacking a single winner, finished eighth in the meet with a total of only 11 points. It garnered four points with a second in the mile run, four with a second in the half-mile relay, two with a fourth in the 440 and one with a fifth in the 220.

Downingtown and North Coventry were the county teams in Class B and neither was among the contenders. Downingtown scored seven points through the medium of "Pepper" Petrella's second place in the record-breaking javelin throw and Leland Wilson's third in the 880-yard run. Don Kinckner gave North Coventry third place points in the 100-yard dash and Vaughan Anderson took third in the mile to amass six points for the northern Chester county team.

#### Buckwalter Second

Earl Buckwalter, West Chester distance ace, gave the crowd one of the biggest thrills of the day as he battled Warren Van Ingen, of Upper Darby, in the four lap grind. Buckwalter was out in front throughout three laps but dropped to third place as the field sprinted at the outset of the final lap. Van Ingen raced to a 15-yard lead as he stepped down the backstretch on the final lap. At the turn, however, Buckwalter put on the pressure and came sprinting down the stretch on the heels of the Upper Darby flier. In this stretch drive, Buckwalter nipped Gow, of Upper Darby, who was in second place, and was just a few steps behind when Van Ingen breasted the tape.

The West Chester half-mile relay team was defeated by the Chester High team which set a record of 1:32.4 last year and equalled it again this year. Bill Herkins took fourth place points for the Garnet and White in the 440 and Snyder

Phoenixville, the only other county team in Class A, scored only one point. Steve Magyar finishing fifth in the 200-yard low hurdles.
