RIDLEY PARK IS AGAIN TOP TEAM IN P.L.A.A. TRACK

Unbeaten Parkers Show Way in Class 'B'; Norristown Wins Class 'A'

County Qualifies 21 Individuals in District 1 Prelim to State Finals

A squad of at least 21 individuals and six relay teams from Delaware County will journey to State College next Saturday afternoon to compete for state championships in the annual P. L. A. A. track meet.

This group of runners, jumpers and throwers won places on the select group by taking first or second in the District One championships at Upper Darby on Saturday afternoon.

Fourteen youngsters and four relay teams from Class "B" and seven, perhaps eight, individuals and two relay teams from Class "A" will carry county colors into competition against representatives from the other eleven districts of the state.

Ridley Park High kept intact its record of having won every meet it has entered this year by romping to an easy victory in the Class "B" events, scoring 60 1-10 points to 36 1-5 for Ambler with Springfield a creditable third with 23 1-10 points.

Lower Merion and Norristown staged a ding-dong battle for Class "A" laurels which went to the last event, the pole vault, before Norristown could win out with 49 1/2 points to 46 2-3 for the Ardmore team. Upper Darby was third with 32 1-3.

Walter Soroka, Chester's southpaw weight star, won two Class "A" district championships when he tossed the shot 51 feet 5 inches and flung the javelin 176 feet 10 inches. Both were best marks of the year for a county athlete, but were below the district standards.

Carl Elmes, chunky weight man from Ridley Park, also won two titles, taking the Class "B" laurels in the shot put and discus. In the latter event he set a new district record of 144 feet 1 1/2 inches to break his own former mark by almost ten feet, the old record being listed at 134 feet 11 inches.

Bill Morgan, of Springfield, also broke a record when he skipped over the 120-yard low hurdles for a Class "B" record of 13.4 seconds. This was set in a qualifying heat but Morgan still won the event although in two-tenths of a second slower time.

Jim Eisman, of Upper Darby, cleared the Class "A" 120-yard high hurdles in record-equaling time of 15.3 seconds in a qualifying heat but could do no better than third in the finals as he hit two hurdles and lost valuable yardage.

New records in Class "A" were also credited to Jim Facioli, of West Chester, who ran over the 200-yard low hurdles in new time of 22.9 seconds, and Will Strong, of Lower Merion, who tossed the discus 150 feet 1 1/2 inches.

Two places on the state squad are in doubt, Tom Hickman, of Springfield, and Joe Gary, of Swarthmore, tied for second in the Class "B" pole vault while Vic Menghetti and Don Sparks, both of Haverford, tied with a Norristown jumper for second in the Class "A" high jump.

Springfield and Ridley Park finished one-two in both the half-mile and mile Class "B" relays to grab off the State College trip there while Media and Upper Darby finished one-two in the Class "A" mile, giving Delaware county six of the eight relay representatives of District One.
