## GENERAL INFORMATION

- This District Track and Field Championship Meet is being held under the jurisdiction of the Board of Control, P.I.A.A. All contestants must meet P.I.A.A. eligibility rules. Events, conditions, etc., are governed by the National Federation of High Schools' rules.
- Class A schools are those whose total enrollments (boys and girls) in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, on October 1, 1955, were 500 or more; Class B schools are those with enrollments under 500 in the same grades on the same date.
- Two participants per school is the maximum permitted in all events.
- No contestant may participate in more than three events.
- No post entries, changes in entry lists, or substitutions are allowed.
- There will be no semi-finals in either track or field events. Trial heats will be necessary in certain events, but in the 440, 880, the mile and both relays, only finals will be held. If there are too many contestants for one heat in these events, they will be run against time, each main place winner being timed. The first five place winners will be determined by their time performances.
- In the 180-yard low hurdles, the first hurdle shall be placed 20 yards from the start and the remaining hurdles at 20-yard intervals. The distance from the last hurdle to the finish shall be 20 yards.
- In the 120-yard high hurdles event for Class A, 10 hurdles, 39 inches high, will be used. The first hurdle is 15 yards from the starting line. Each of the hurdles will be 10 yards apart, leaving 15 yards between the last hurdle and the finish line.
- In all finals of running events, the times of both first and second places shall be taken and recorded.
- In the one-mile relays for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run one-quarter of the mile. In the half-mile relay, each contestant shall run 220 yards.
- The weights of the shot used in P.I.A.A. meets shall be 12 pounds. The discus and javelin shall conform to N.C.A.A. standards. Shot and disci used in this meet are those belonging to the District Committee. Javelins must be weighed in and inspected before the event by the officials in charge.
- At Upper Darby, hard surfaces are used for the high jump, pole vault and broad jump. Rubber-soled shoes and rubber-soled shoes with pin spikes will be permitted—no others!
- Five places will be scored in each event on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the winners of first, second and third places in each event. Trophies will be presented to the school winning the highest total number of points in each class. Medals and trophies will be distributed to winners from a stand erected on the field.
- The preliminaries will begin at 10:00 A.M. (Daylight Time). Track finals will begin at 2:00 P.M. (Daylight Time). The District Committee desires the meet to be run off without unnecessary delays. Contestants will therefore report promptly for their respective events.

## GENERAL INFORMATION (Continued)

15. To keep the field clear of spectators and to have the meet run under proper conditions, athletes not competing in events will keep away from the track during track events and from field during field events. There will be room in the stands for these people.
16. Coaches must remain in the stands. **This rule will be enforced!**
17. The price of admission to spectators is 75 cents, including a copy of this program.
18. The State Championship Track and Field Meet will be held at Pennsylvania State University on Saturday, May 25, 1957. The classification of schools and the rules for competition are the same as those governing the District Meets. Each of the twelve districts in the Commonwealth may send two teams, Class A and Class B. Each team will be made up of two representatives in each event. In preparing the entry blank for the State Meet, the District Committee will select the contestants that finish first and second in the various events unless notification is given by successful contestants that they cannot participate in the State Meet. In such cases the Committee will select winners of third, fourth and fifth places in order. A relay team will be considered as a "representative" or "contestant." This procedure will be followed in making up both the Class A and Class B District teams.
19. A drawing for places in track events and for order in field events was made by the District Committee before the Meet.
20. If an athlete is competing in the trials (100, 220, both hurdles) he may pass his trials in broad or high jump (if entered) but he must report for these events within **three** minutes after completion of the trials and remain at jumping pits.
21. Athletes qualifying for the State Championship Meet must be reported by their coaches to Mr. Lewis concerning their decision to take part in the State Meet, **immediately after the event.** The District will collect \$10.00 from each athlete qualifying for and making the trip to the State Championship Meet at the State University; the remainder of the cost will be borne by the District Committee. Mr. Lewis will be in charge of the District One teams on the trip and at the Meet. Mr. Fishburn will act as financial representative of the District Committee for the State Meet. No refund will be made for athletes traveling in private cars. Permission for such travel must be obtained from Mr. Lewis, for athletes to be permitted to represent District One at the State Meet.
22. In field events (shot, discus, javelin, running broad jump), every contestant will be allowed four trials. The six best will qualify for the finals, with three trials each.
23. Coaches and winners in the shot put, discus throw, high jump, broad jump, will note that at the State Championship Meet the surfaces will be **hard surfaced.** No spikes will be permitted on the shot and discus circles. Rubber-soled shoes must be used in these events.
24. The high jump will start at five feet two inches. The bar will be raised by two-inch intervals to six feet; by one-inch intervals above six feet. Three misses at each height will disqualify. The pole vault will start at nine feet. The bar will be raised by six-inch intervals to ten feet; by three-inch intervals to eleven feet; by two-inch intervals above eleven feet. Three misses at each height will disqualify.
25. Both first and second place relay teams in Class A and Class B will be taken to the State Meet by the District. Both first and second place relay teams, in Classes A and B, will receive the same financial support from the District as any other first and second event winners.
26. Starting blocks may be used when available.

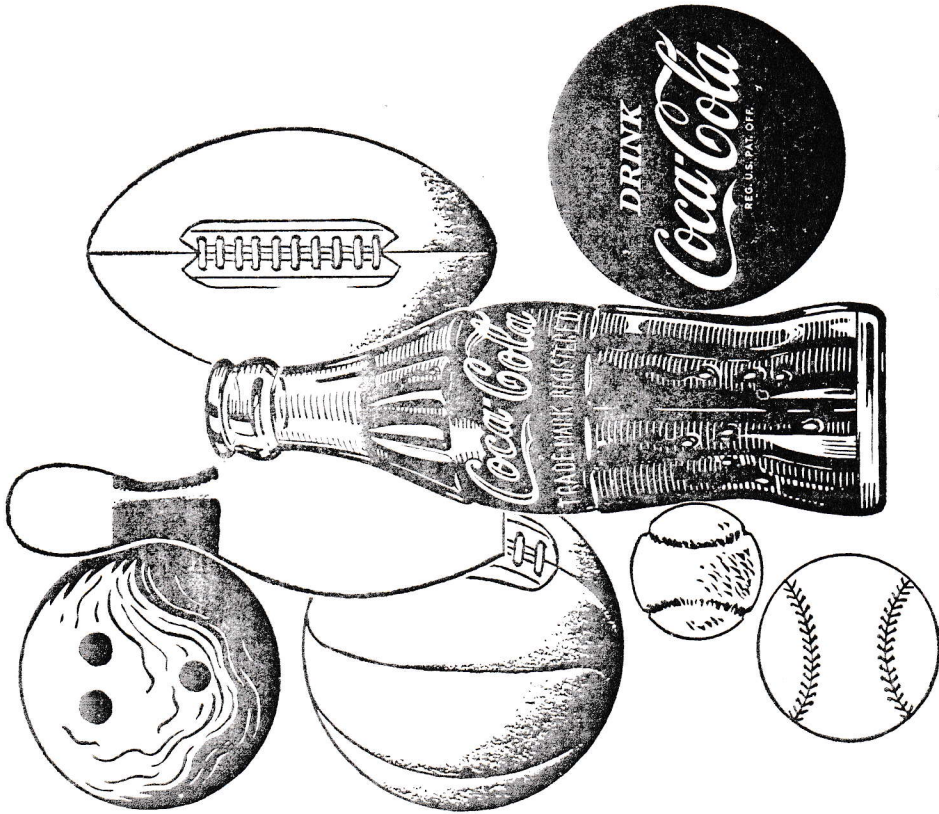

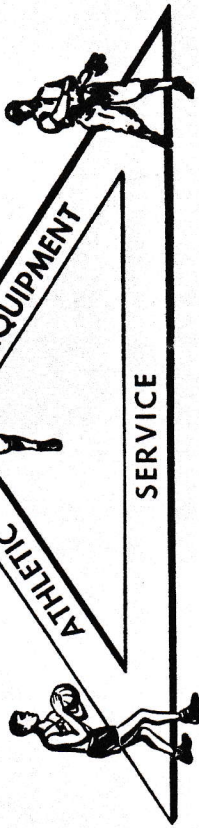

# Lower Merion's Hearn

## Ridley Twp. Star Vaults 13 Feet For State Mark

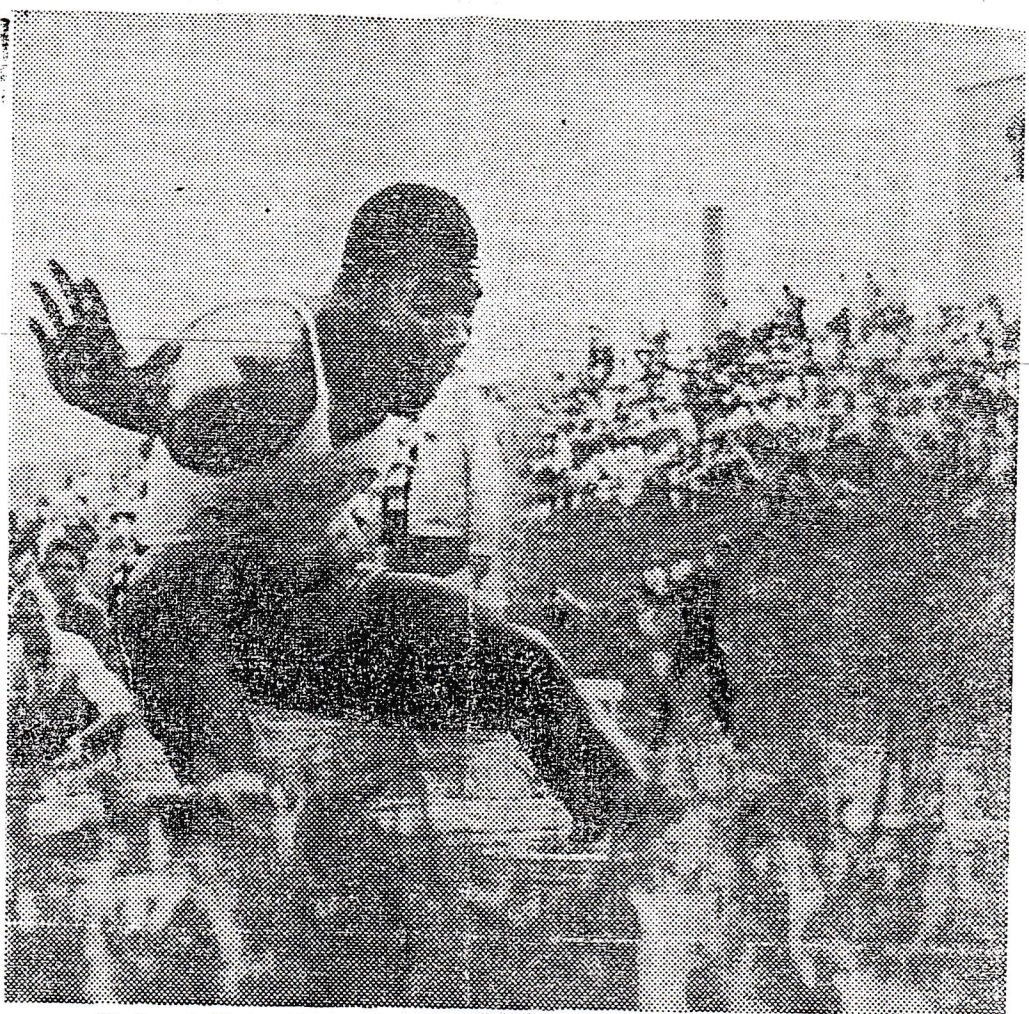
George Hearn, Lower Merion's All-American track star, cleared the 120-yard high hurdles in 0:13.9 to better the National schoolboy record and Ridley Township's Norbert McNulty pole vaulted 13 feet to top the recognized State mark at the 31st annual District One PIAA championships at Upper Darby High yesterday.

Hearn's victory, run in a cross-wind (he later won the 180 lows), served as the springboard as Lower Merion won the Class A Championship with 57 1/6 points, far ahead of second-place Haverford's 29. Ridley Park, with three firsts and some good backing up, won Class B honors with 32 points and Bristol took second with 25.

### BROWN ALSO TOPS MARK

Hearn's hurdle mark broke the recognized standard of 0:14.0 that is shared by Joe Batiste, Tucson (Ariz.) High, Lee Miller, Burbank HS (Tex.), both of whom set theirs in 1939, and Bill Curtis, Waurika (Okla.), in 1952. Second to Hearn was Norristown's Reggie Brown whose 0:14.3 also topped the District mark of 0:14.4 made by Coatesville's Rod Perry in 1953.

While Hearn's performance got the program off to a rousing start, McNulty detained most of a good-sized crowd to the end when his 13-foot vault concluded the day's activity. He broke Gene Zeiner's District record (12-6 1/4) and surpassed the ex-Lower Merion great's State mark (12-10 1/4).

#### MISSES AT 13-3

McNulty, who had done 12-8 earlier in the season, won out over the rest of the field at 11-6, but requested to go further. He made 12, 12-6, 12-11 $\frac{1}{4}$ , then 13, but missed his chances at 13-3.

While the performances of Hearn and McNulty overshadowed others, four other records were shattered and two were tied as close to 600 athletes participated in the meet, the stepping stone to the State championships Saturday at Penn State University.

Chester and Darby mile relay teams accounted for new marks in Class A and B, respectively; Lower Merion's 880 relay quartet established another and Darby's Dan Maloney joined Hearn and McNulty in the individual winner's circle by taking the 180 low hurdles (Class B) in 0:20.0, one-tenth of a second faster than the previous best.

#### JOHNSON TIES RECORD

Richard Johnson, Haverford, tied the Class A 100-yard dash record at 0:09.9, and Ridley Park's Bill Muesham helped the Vlass B champs to victory by equaling the 220-yard mark in 0:22.2.

Johnson also won the Class A 220 in 0:21.9 to join Hearn, Maloney and Swarthmore's Cal Coleman in the double victory column. Coleman scored 14 of his team's 23 points with 440 and 880 victories and a second in the broad jump.

Bristol, despite not scoring a victory, had nice backing up with its seven-man team. Ambler, with victories in the 880 relay and high jump, on Merv Kelly's 5-10 leap, placed third with 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ . Norristown took third with 28 and Chester placed fourth with 24 in Class A.
