THERE WERE a number of surprises in the District One track and field Championships at Norristown's Roosevelt Field last Saturday, and two of the biggest have to be Junior Mike O'Neill and Sophomore Bill Stoppel in Class B.

The pair of Ridley Park stalwarts wasn't expected to do much, judging by their previous performances, but both came through with firsts.

O'Neill, who won the Section Four high jump event with 5-8 and couldn't do a thing in the other meets, zoomed 5-10 in the district.

EYE OPENER

Put these predictions in your at hand.

In Saturday's P.I.A.A. state-wide Track and Field Championships at University Park, Chester High's Stanford Johnson will set a new record in the 120 yd hurdles.

Also: Media High's Bill Truax will better the Class B 880 record.

Other Delco athletes who will score firsts will be: (Class A)—Joe Piela of Eddystone in the pole vault and Ridley Township's mile relay team of Tim Boyce, Jack Hoopes, Rich Kithin and Mike Komarnicki; (Class B) — Media's Larry Larson in the 100, Ridley Park's Larry Murray in the Mile and Jether Providence's Bill Heiderberger in the 440.

"I figured that the best Mike could do would be 5-9," said RP's 24-year old head coach Joe Stefanowicz. "But he surprised us all."

Stoppel, a 6-1, 175-pound lad, who has been having foul trouble all year, which is his first time out for the sport, was an even bigger stunner in the javelin, which he won with a toss of 162-7.

Before the Districts, Stoppel was a complete unknown, finishing fourth in Section Four meet and never being able to toss the spear farther than 56'.

Stoppel was the way he roared back.

Third going into the final, he beat out Media High's heralded Doug Brown, who had never tasted defeat before this meet.

Stefanowicz gleefully pointed out that only two Class A javelin chucks posted a better mark than Stoppel.

Ridley Park Captain, Larry Murray, came through as expected in the Class B mile, topping the field in 4:36.2.

The win by Murray, who is undefeated in dual competition (6) and holds the Section Four meet mark, had added significance for Stefanowicz, a Lafayette grad who is in his third year of coaching RP.

Besides shattering an 18-year-old record in the mile (the previous best was 4:36.6, set by Pollock Montco's Springfield High), Murray's time of 4:36.2 improved on Coach Stefanowicz' time of 4:41.2 when he won the District One Class B mile while running for Southampton High School (near Willow Grove).

BEFORE competing at Norristown, Murray's best time for the mile this season had been 4:41.

Stefanowicz experienced only one disappointment Saturday. He figured Joe Sheffer would qualify for the State meet in the javelin, but Joe finished third, missing by four feet.

"Probably if Joe hadn't gone on that Senior Class trip to New York on Friday, he might have done better," smiled Stefanowicz.

As things turned out, the Ridley mentor is ecstatic over getting three boys to qualify for the State competition on Saturday at University Park.

This will be the first time since 1958 that RP will be represented in the State meet.

For Ridley, the track famine hasn't been too lengthy. Back in 1953, the Parkers annexed the Class B title in the State.

Stefanowicz doesn't predict anything like that for this coming Saturday, but his hopes are high on Murray, O'Neill and Stoppel, who proved they can deliver in the clutch.

Media coach George Loper felt that "if Truax is really pressed he could do the half-mile in two minutes.

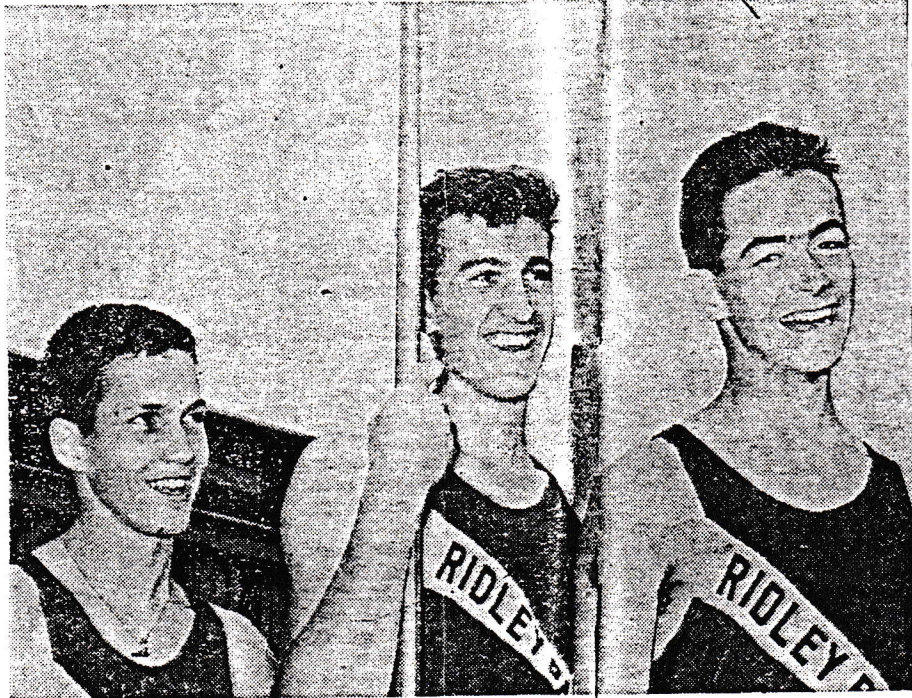

The Rams copped five first places in College Division competition including the mile relay where Ron Bonnett, Jon Bearde, Jim Pfrogner and Bob Johnson sped to a 3:24.9 clocking.

Pfrogner, the talented sophomore, also posted a first place in the 220-yard lows and tied for fourth in the high jump.

Johnson won the 440-yard dash in a blistering 49.9 and came back to take a second in the 220.

Jack Hart was victorious in the 880, covering that distance in the fine time of 1:55.7.

Ken Shumaker won the mile in 4:24.3, wilted in the torrid heat of the two-mile, but still managed a third place.

Bonnett Scores

Bonnett was a valuable point contributor for the Rams. The flashy soph got a second in the 220 and third in the 440. Bob Hable was third in the mile while Ron Hanna captured a third in the low hurdles.

Lance Stauffer placed second to Albright's Grant Krow in the high jump as the latter broke one of the two meet records with a leap of six feet, 5 3/4 inches.

The Rams' Bob Bessey and Bob McKerney tied for fourth in the pole vault, while Bearde finished fourth in the 880 and Gene Levine fifth in the javelin.

Turning on a blistering kick Carter ripped off a 1:58.5 in the 880 nearly two seconds under his Ches-Mont time the week before which had shattered a record standing since 1937.

JACKOWSKI battled defending mile champion Ken McCloskey of Harrilton to the tape before losing out as his rival was timed in 4:32.4. Boyertown's Bob Stringfellow, who turned in a sensational 4:30.4 the week before, faltered in the 96-degree heat finish far back.

Coach Charlie Ax's nine-man Downingtown High team copped a pair of firsts in the B competition.

Gordie Flowers, Walt Horsey, John Horsey and Bill Pollock flashed to a 1:34.9 to win the 880-yard relay a tenth of a second in front of Media, as the winners of five different heats finished within one second of each other.

Bill Pollock navigated the 180 lows in 20.3 to nip Morrisville's Bruce Gerber by a tenth of a second and Clarence Wilkerson was clocked in 4:39.2 taking a big second in the mile.

The long day took its toll in the mile relay as the Whippets could only register a 3:45, more than 10 seconds off their Ches-Mont

time which would have won.

A TRIO of Chester County followed Taylor's record vault at Downingtown's Mark Jones cleared 11-2 and Unionville's Jerry Sturgis and Downingtown's Edgar
