Girls' pole vault jumping in popularity

Day 1

The District 1 championship fielded 43 athletes, with Upper Darby's Michelle Ezzie coming out ahead.

In only its first year of PIAA competition, the girls' pole vault has become one of the most popular events in high school track.

Forty-three girls were entered in the event yesterday in the District 1 championship meet at Coatesville High School — 42 from Class AAA schools and one from a Class AA school.

Conversely, only 26 boy vaulters qualified for the meet.

And nearly five hours after the girls' competition began, Upper Darby sophomore Michelle Ezzie beat Sara Dougherty of Springfield (Delco) to become the first District 1 champion, at 9 feet, 9 inches.

"Our coach asked us who wanted to try it, and it sounded like fun," Ezzie said, using an explanation that many first-time vaulters have given this spring. "It's really neat."

Ezzie and Dougherty, seeded first and second, respectively, passed at the first three heights and went in at 8-3. The two have battled all spring, with Dougherty winning the event in the Central League championships and Ezzie winning in the Delaware County championship meet.

Both cleared 9-9 yesterday, but Ezzie was the winner because she had only one miss at the height and Dougherty had two.

"You only have six or eight really good jumps in one day, so the later you come in, the better you jump at the big heights," said Dougherty, a junior.

Ezzie, who had been a middle-dis-

tance runner before she became a pole-vaulter, wears glasses when she vaults, and yesterday she wore a helmet for the first time in competition.

"I saw a girl get hurt at a meet," she explained. "Once you vault, you forget you have it on."

Their biggest problem yesterday may have been waiting until the vaulting got serious. The event began at 6 feet at 9:30 a.m. and did not end until 2:30 p.m. It went so long that the boys' AAA pole-vault event was postponed until this morning.

The girls' AA winner was St. Pius X freshman Marissa Dudek, who cleared 8-0. As the only AA entrant, she needed only to clear the opening height of 6-0 to win the district championship and move on to the state championship meet next week at Shippensburg University.

Since she was the only Class AA vaulter, she competed at the same time as the 42 AAA girls.

"I was getting real nervous," she said. "I wasn't sure if I'd make it over 6-6, so I started at 6-0."

With a state-qualifying height of 8-6 for Class AAA, nine girls advanced to the state field from the district.

There were 15 field-event finals yesterday, and one double champion.

Christine Heffernan, a Springfield (Delco) senior who will compete for Villanova next season, won the girls' AAA shot put (40 feet, 3 1/2 inches) and javelin (131-8).

Merton Mercy senior Maisha Tyler, the defending district Class AA champion in the 100- and 200-meter

dashes and in the long jump, and the state champion in the latter event, did not compete.

Merton Mercy is now a Class AAA school and Tyler was the district's No. 1 seed for the long jump. But she tore cartilage in a knee during the triple jump in last Saturday's Bicentennial League championship meet and is spending the weekend in the stands.

Truman runner enjoys madcap

Stefani Allen had the busiest two days of her track career.

The Harry S Truman senior ran a total of 11 races, including trials, semifinals and finals, in the PIAA District 1 track and field championships at Coatesville High School yesterday and Friday — and finished first nearly every time.

She crossed the finish line in first place in four finals yesterday, winning the 100 and 200 meters, the 100-meter hurdles, and anchoring the Tigers to first in the 4x100-meter relay.

"I was really confident, since I was seeded first in everything," Allen said after leading Truman to the Class AAA team title. "Next week [at the state championship meet], I'm going to try my hardest to do it again."

Allen, who has signed a national letter of intent to attend Manhattan College, began her afternoon by winning the hurdles in 14.81 seconds, then won the 100 in 12.19 seconds. She had won semifinal races both events yesterday morning after running trials on Friday.

She then followed Talia Brown, Tuesday Davis and Cheryl Cook on the relay, winning in 47.02 seconds.

Allen finished her work by out-sprinting Chester's Ruby Jackson in a tough 200, winning in 24.53 seconds.

"The 200 was tough," she said. "[Jackson] was challenging me."

Allen and her three sprint teammates will go, as a unit, to the state meet at Shippensburg, where Allen has competed since her freshman days. She was the state 200-meter dash champion as a sophomore.

Allen was the lone triple individual winner at the district meet, but there were seven double winners.

In boys AAA, Council Rock's Dan Coval won both the 1,600 and 3,200 meters, then decided to compete in just the longer race at the state meet, an event that the junior has won the last two years.

Glen Mills' Anthony Marlow won both the 200 and 400 in Class AAA races, and St. Pius X's Tom Parlapaniano, the defending state champion in the AA 1,600 and 3,200, related as district champion in both events.

Springfield's Michelle Nash won the girls AA 800 and 1,600 meter events, and Lower Moreland had a pair of double winners in the weight throws. Jeff Rubenstein

added the discus title to the shot put that he won on Friday, and Katie McLaughlin won both of the girls' events.

And Shawn Lubeski of Octorora won both the AA high jump and 100-meter high hurdles.

Council Rock's Coval decided to concentrate on just one event at the state meet after using the district meet as a test.

Glen Mills' depth won another boys' Class AAA team title for the Bulls, while Girard College won the boys' Class AA team title and Pottstown was the girls' AA champion.
